REALITY #1: God is a **GRACIOUS SAVIOR**. (Nehemiah 9:5b-15, 31-33)

The recounting of Israel's past is not "old history." It is through this history that they come to realize one of the greatest truths about God—"God has never dealt with his people as they deserved."

The proper responses to the reality of God's Gracious Saving Work are ADORATION and GRATITUDE.

1) One part of a proper response to God's great goodness is ADORATION.

Scripture: Luke 7:47; Psalms 107:43; 1 Samuel 12:24

Note the mercy of God interwoven in the story of Israel's rebellion.

Scripture: Nehemiah 9:17b, 19a, 20-25, 28b-29a, 30a (1 Timothy 1:15)

God is not merely looking for a church full of "doers." God wants "delighters."

2) Another part of a proper response to God's great goodness is **GRATITUDE**.

Gratitude which is mere feelings is hardly gratitude at all.



REALITY #2: We are GREAT SINNERS. (Nehemiah 9:16-38)

The proper responses to the reality of our GREAT SINFULNESS are REPENTANCE and OBEDIENCE.

1) Understanding the reality of our great sin and his great goodness should bring us to broken repentance. (v. 33-35)

Only when we see the reality of the depths of our sin can we then fully rejoice in the GOOD NEWS of God!

(Ephesians 2:1-7; James 4:6-10)

2) Understanding the reality of our great sin and his great goodness should produce obedience motivated by gratitude. (v. 38 and Chapter 10)

Scripture: 2 Corinthians 7:10-11

Godly grief demands action and the appropriate action is to run FROM our sin and to run TO our GREAT SAVIOR!
