Nehemiah: Servant to the King "Responding to Spiritual Carelessness" Nehemiah 13:4-31 (Part 1 of 2)

Introduction: Nehemiah had returned to Jerusalem and found the city and the people in spiritual disarray. In Nehemiah's absence, God had sent the prophet Malachi to address the very issues that Nehemiah was forced to deal with upon his return. (Malachi 1:6-14; 2:1-9; 2:10-16; 3:6-12)

Nehemiah was deeply passionate, wisely decisive and unashamedly proactive in responding to FOUR MAJOR ISSUES (Issues 1 & 2 in Part I, Issues 3 & 4 in Part II):

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Nehemiah was deeply passionate, wisely decisive and unashamedly proactive in responding to FOUR MAJOR ISSUES (Issues 1-2 in Part 1, Issues 2-4 in Part 2):

Issue #1:

Through Compromise God's House Was Defiled.

(Nehemiah 13:4-9)

Summary: God's leaders had compromised and allowed God's temple to be the dwelling of an enemy.

- Tobiah the Ammonite was a thorn in Nehemiah's flesh. (2:19-20; 4:3-5; 6:17-19) who now resided in the house of God (13:4)!
- Eliashib's loyalty was to Tobiah rather than God and this led to sinful compromise.

Nehemiah's Response:

- Nehemiah decisively removed what was unclean.
- Nehemiah thoroughly restored what was pure.

God's grace and His glory call for his people to clean house!

Scriptures: Heb. 12:1-2; Titus 2:11-12; 1 John 1:9; 1 Cor. 6:19-20

The Outcome: Nehemiah's decisive action against Tobiah's temple defilement, made way for correcting the next issue, the failure to support God's work.

Issue #2:

Through Thoughtlessness God's Work Was Ignored

(Nehemiah 13:10-14)

Summary: God's people had misplaced priorities. Their godless living led to God's work and God's workers being sadly neglected.

- Failure to think about God and His Work leads to spiritually careless and selfish living. Selfish living leads to diminished giving.
- When we are NOT giving faithfully and liberally, our response of repentance ought to be immediate and decisive.

Nehemiah's Response:

- c. Nehemiah confronted the leaders.
- d. Nehemiah chose and organized reliable men.

The Outcome: The response of the people to Nehemiah's efforts to clean house and to reprioritize the work of God was renewed giving.

Conclusion:

Nehemiah knew that HE was not the hero of this story.

He knew the future of Israel lay in the hands of a gracious God.
