Introduction:

This account in Luke 7 makes it clear that the sinner who has found immeasurable forgiveness through faith in Christ will bear the fruit of unrelenting love.

Reality #1: Unrelenting Love Gives Evidence to Genuine Faith.

The nature of her love is characterized by...

- Zeal
- Humility
- Confidence
- Surrender

Reality #2: Unmatched Forgiveness is the Root of Abounding Love.

Jesus' parable was not about the amount of sin, but the AWARENESS of FORGIVENESS.

The Pattern of Gratitude and Love for God:

Guilt: A painful awareness of sin.

Grace (Gospel): A deep understanding for and appreciation of the Gospel.

Gratitude: An earnest love for the Savior.

God: A desire for more of God.

Reality #3: Genuine Faith Finds Immeasurable Forgiveness in Christ.

The progression of faith, forgiveness and love:

- By faith the sinner trusts Christ's promise.
- As a result, the sinner finds forgiveness, salvation and peace (v. 48, 50)
- The forgiven sinner responds in unabashed love for Christ.
- The sinner is truly and genuinely happy and wants more of Christ.
