**Introduction:** Paul was passionate for the joy and hope of the Philippian church as seen by his consistent warnings and heartfelt tears.

- I. The False Hope of the Earthly Citizen
  - A. The lives of the earthly minded reveal that they are enemies of the Gospel.

Scriptures: 1 Peter 2:5,10-12; Titus 1:11-14:

### B. The ultimate destiny of the earthly minded is one of eternal loss.

1)It is good to look to the ultimate destiny of all things.

**Scriptures:** Deuteronomy 32:29; Lamentations 1:9; Jeremiah 17:11; Hebrews 13:7

2)Worldly pleasures will end in everlasting destruction.

**Scriptures:** 1 Timothy 6:9-10; Romans 6:21-23; 8:6, 13; Galatians 6:8; 2 Corinthians 11:15

# C. The conduct of the earthly minded is controlled by their <mark>fleshly desires.</mark>

Scriptures: Romans 8:13; Colossians 3:2; Philippians 3:13-14; Hebrews 2:11

# D. The glory of the earthly minded is nothing more than shameful living.

Scriptures: Philippians 3:3; Hosea 4:7

The only glory worth pursuing is the glory of God, everything else falls shamefully short.

- II. The Future Hope of the Heavenly Citizen
  - A. The conduct of the heavenly-minded is rooted in their heavenly citizenship.

Scriptures: Philippians 1:7; 1:27; Colossians 3:1-4

- B. The ultimate destiny of the heavenly citizen is eternal salvation.
  (3:20)
- C. The present lives of the heavenly citizen are controlled by their future hope.

2)The Certainty of Glorified Bodies (3:21)

3)The Guarantee of Divine Power (3:21)
