## I. Love that Let Lazarus Die

Note: Love is doing what is ultimately (and eternally!) for someone.
1) The Setting: This situation involves Jesus' close, personal, friends!
2) The Summary: This entire situation is not about Lazarus but is about the of God!
John 9:2-3; Romans 8:18, 28 -
Psalm 63:3 - "Because Your steadfast love is better than life, my lips will praise You."
3) The Slowness: Jesus delays He loves Mary, Martha, and Lazarus!
Note: To love like Christ, we must be about helping people know & see God's glory.
Colossians 1:28 - "Him we proclaim, warning everyone and teaching everyone with all wisdom, that we may present everyone mature in Christ."
4) The Steadfastness: Jesus has perfect in the plan & timing of God!
Proverbs 29:25; Psalm 23:4; Psalm 56:3; 2 Corinthians 5:6-8 -
5) The Sadness: The disciples (specifically Thomas) exhibit a pessimistic
