2 Corinthians 12:9-10 - "I will boast all the more gladly of my weaknesses, so that the power of Christ may rest upon me. For the sake of Christ, then, I am content with weaknesses, insults, hardships, persecutions, and calamities. For when I am weak, then I am strong."

John 12:37-50 -

I. THE TRUTH ABOUT UNBELIEF

A. The Reality of Human

John 1:11 - "He came to His own, and His own people did not receive Him."

Note: As it relates	to salvation and unbelief,	Scripture clearly affirms	human culpability and
divine sovereignty.	To be biblical, we must e	embrace both.	

John 3:19 - "And this is the	judgment: the light h	nas come into the w	orld, and peo	ple loved the

darkness rather than the light because their works were evil."

Note: ______ is the WORST DAY to follow Jesus.

John 12:37, 42-43 -

John 5:44 - "How can you believe, when you receive glory from one another and do not seek the glory that comes from the only God?"

Note: When we (in complete dependence upon Christ) place our faith and trust in Jesus, He (that is God - God the Father, God the Son, and God the Spirit) get's _____ the glory and praise!

Note: True saving faith results in being satisfied in Christ, not craving the praise of ______.

Galatians 1:10 - "If I were still trying to please man, I would not be a servant of Christ."

B. The Reality of Divine
Isaiah 53:1-3; John 12:39-40; Romans 9:15-18 -
Note: God is free, God is sovereign, and He has the right to do as He with His creation
Romans 11:33-36 - "Oh, the depth of the riches and wisdom and knowledge of God! How unsearchable are His judgments and how inscrutable His ways! 'For who has known the mind of the Lord, or who has been His counselor?' 'Or who has given a gift to Him that he might be repaid?' For from Him and through Him and to Him are all things. To Him be glory forever. Amen."
Acts 4:27-28 - "for truly in this city there were gathered together against Your holy servant Jesus, whom You anointed, both Herod and Pontius Pilate, along with the Gentiles and the peoples of Israel, to do whatever Your hand and Your plan had predestined to take place."
Isaiah 6:1-10; John 12:41 -
Note: What Isaiah saw and spoke of was, in fact, the glory of

2) It is true that Jesus came to save, but one day everyone will stand to His word. John 12:46-48; Hebrews 4:12-13 -
3) Jesus faithfully speaks the message of salvation, a message that comes from the Father. **John 12:49-50; John 3:16-21 -**
