B. Pray to see an of growth, fruit, knowledge, strength, perseverance, and joy.

A worthy walk is done not in the shadows but in the light. (Ephesians 5:8)

A worthy walk loves and embraces God's wisdom. (Ephesians 5:15)

A worthy walk loves and submits to truth. (3 John 3-4)
