Verse 5: "The people of Israel did as the Lord commanded Moses; they allotted the land."

I. RELENTLESS FAITH IN THE PROMISES OF GOD

A. Chapter 14: The Tenacious & Passionate Faith of Caleb

1) The All-Encompassing Nature of Faith

Verse 8: "...yet I wholly followed the Lord my God."

Verse 9: "...you have wholly followed the Lord my God."

Verse 14: "...he wholly followed the Lord, the God of Israel."

2) The Anchor and Active Resolve of Faith

Joshua 14:6b, 10, 12 -

"I wait for the Lord, my soul waits, and in His word I hope." (Psalm 130:5)

"But someone will say, 'You have faith and I have works.' Show me your faith apart from your works, and I will show you my faith by my works." (James 2:18)

"<u>Examine yourselves</u>, to see whether you are in the faith. <u>Test yourselves</u>. Or do you not realize this about yourselves, <u>that Jesus Christ is in you</u>? - unless indeed you fail to meet the test!" (2 Cor. 13:5)

3) The Backward and Forward Looking Gaze of Faith

Joshua 14:10-12 -

"Therefore, my beloved brothers, be <u>steadfast</u>, <u>immovable</u>, <u>always abounding</u> in the work of the Lord, knowing that in the Lord <u>your labor is not in vain</u>." (1 Corinthians 15:58)

Joshua 14:12 -

Verses 1-12: Deceptively Exciting Verses

Verses 13-19: Faith in Action

Verses 20-63: The Substantial, Concrete Reality of God's Blessings

"But our citizenship is in heaven, and from it <u>we await a Savior</u>, the Lord Jesus Christ, <u>who will</u> <u>transform our lowly body to be like His glorious body</u>, by the power that enables Him even to subject all things to Himself. Therefore, my brothers, whom I love and long for, my joy and crown, <u>stand firm</u> <u>thus in the Lord</u>, my beloved." (Philippians 3:20-4:1)
