Sermon Title: "A 'Foolish' Message & The Power of God"- Part 1 of 2

Scripture: 1 Corinthians 1:18-30

Introduction:

The church is often divided by chasing the wisdom of the world, when we should be united in proclaiming the message of the Cross.

1. The message of the cross is central to God's redemptive plan. (v. 18a)

Scripture: Luke 24:46-47; Romans 3:23; 5:8; Acts 20:21

2. The wisdom of the world opposes the word (message) of the cross. (v. 18b-20)

Scripture: Isaiah 29:14; Proverbs 13:13

3. The message of the Cross is God's only means for salvation. (v. 21)

Scripture: Romans 10:13-14; Psalm 14:1-3

4. The message of the cross does not meet our demands. (v. 22-23)

Scripture: Romans 1:4

Those that are perishing reject the message of the cross of Christ:

- **A.** They reject Christ as Messiah and Savior.
- **B.** They reject the cross as the means of salvation.
- 5. The message of the cross emphasizes $\frac{\text{God's}}{\text{Foots}}$ power & wisdom. (v. 24-25)
 - A. Salvation is a divine work. (Ephesians 2:4-5)
 - **B.** Salvation is an inclusive work. (Ephesians 2:13)
 - C. Salvation is a gracious work. (Ephesians 2:8-9)

Conclusion:

The church that fails to clearly proclaim the wisdom and power of the cross, will be characterized by powerless foolishness.

Questions for Further Study, Reflection, and Application...

- What is the message of the cross?
- Who are "the perishing" and why are they perishing?
- What were the demands of the Jews and Greeks? How were they dissppointed by the message of the cross?
- Why are Christians tempted to resort to other means to draw people to Jesus? What is wrong with these other means?
- Is God really foolish or weak? What does Paul mean by "the foolishness of God" and the "weakness of God"?
