Introduction: Psalm 100:1-3

At the center of joyless service is a proud heart.

At the center of glad service is a worshipful heart. (Psalm 2:11)

What do we learn about the Apostles rejoicing? (v. 41-42)

- 1. Their gladness was stimulated by opposition to their service. (v. 41a)
  - Your mouth reveals what your heart worships. (Luke 6:45)
- 2. Their gladness was shared in the community of fellow servants. (v. 41b; Ephesians 5:20; Thessalonians 5:16-18)

"When large numbers of people share their joy in common, the happiness of each is greater because each adds fuel to the other's flame." Augustine

- 3. Their gladness was rooted in their identity in Christ. (v. 41c)
  - It is an honor to be dishonored for our association with the Suffering Savior. (1 Peter 4:13-14; Philippians 1:29; Matthew 5:10-12)
- 4. Their gladness fueled continual boldness and faithfulness in service. (v. 42; Romans 12:1)

**Conclusion:** Joyful service to our Savior is not only a beautiful expression of love to God, but also a powerful witness to the world! (*Philippians 2:14-15*)
