

Sermon Title: "Marriage, Divorce & the Gospel"

Scripture: 1 Corinthians 7:10-16

Introduction:

Marriage is a good gift, designed by God for the blessing of a man and woman and their community, and God is magnified when couples fully delight in His gracious gift.

1. If a believing man and woman are married, they should remain married in submission to Christ. (v. 10-11)

Scripture: Matthew 5:31-32; Matthew 19:3-9

- Jesus gave a clear command for persevering in marriage and a gracious concession in the case of sexual immorality.
- 2. If a believer is married to a consenting unbeliever, they should remain married as an influence on their family for the Gospel. (v. 12-14)

Scripture: 1 Corinthians 14:37; Romans 10:9-10; 1 Peter 3:1-2

- The continued presence of the salt and light of the Gospel in the home serves as a powerful evangelistic influence upon one's spouse and children.
- **3.** If an unbelieving spouse leaves a believing spouse, the believer is free. (v. 15-16) Scripture: 1 Corinthians 7:39
 - When one is "not enslaved," they are not bound to their previous marriage vows, freeing the believer to remarry "in the Lord."

Conclusion: Let us honor God's good gift of marriage...

- 1. By faithfully protecting and strengthening marriages.
- 2. By persistently pursuing forgiveness and reconciliation in marriage.
- 3. By humbly submitting to God's instruction on divorce.
- 4. By prayerfully living out the Gospel in our homes.

- How does marriage faithfulness reflect Christ and glorify God?
- How do God's allowances for divorce demonstrate His kindness?
