If a believing man and woman are married, they should married in submission to Christ. (v. 10-11)  Scripture: Matthew 5:31-32; Matthew 19:3-9
• Jesus gave a clear command for in marriage and a gracious concession in the case of sexual immorality.
If a believer is married to a consenting unbeliever, they should married as an influence on their family for the Gospel. (v. 12-14)  Scripture: 1 Corinthians 14:37; Romans 10:9-10; 1 Peter 3:1-2
• The continued presence of the salt and light of the Gospel in the home serves as a powerful influence upon one's spouse and children.
If an unbelieving spouse leaves a believing spouse, the believer is (v. 15-16) Scripture: 1 Corinthians 7:39
• When one is "not enslaved," they are not bound to their previous marriage vows, freeing the believer to "in the Lord."
