Scripture: 1 Corinthians 13:8-13

INTRODUCTION

"But earnestly desire the higher gifts. And I will show you a still more excellent way." (1 Cor. 12:31)

"Love is patient and kind; love does not envy or boast; it is not arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice at wrongdoing, but rejoices with the truth. Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things." (1 Corinthians 13:4-7)

"Love never ends." (1 Corinthians 13:8a)

I. THE PERMANENCE AND PREEMINENCE OF LOVE

"Love never ends. As for <u>prophecies</u>, they will pass away; as for <u>tongues</u>, they will cease; as for <u>knowledge</u>, it will pass away. For we <u>know</u> in part and we <u>prophesy</u> in part, but <u>when the perfect comes</u>, the partial will pass away." (1 Corinthians 13:8-10)

1) Gifts are for time; love is for eternity.

WARNING: You must NOT find your identity, comfort, or security in <u>what</u> you do (in what gift you have) but in <u>who</u> you are in Christ, as a beloved child of God.

Luke 10:17-20 -

Note: Our knowledge at its best, our speech at its best is lacking and incomplete!

"When I was a child, I <u>spoke</u> like a child, I <u>thought</u> like a child, I <u>reasoned</u> like a child. When I became a man, I gave up childish ways." (1 Corinthians 13:11)

2) Don't be content with childish, immature, "baby" ways when it comes to love! GROW!

"For now <u>we see</u> in a mirror dimly, but then <u>face to face</u>. Now <u>I know</u> in part; then <u>I shall know fully</u>, even as I have been fully known." (1 Corinthians 13:12)

3) Every redeemed child of God will ultimately see, know, and <u>experience</u> the glorious perfections, blessings, and benefits of God's eternal love and grace!

1 John 3:2-3 -

Note: In glory, we will fully know and experience the richness of God's love and grace!

"As the Father has loved Me, so have I loved you. Abide in My love." (John 15:9)

"So now faith, hope, and love abide, these three; but the greatest of these is love." (1 Cor. 13:13)

Conclusion: Faith will become sight, Hope will be fully realized, and Love will endure forever!
