I. MEET THE GIANT PSALM 119	
Question #1: What is God's Word LIKE?	
1) God's Word is not only true but it is the	by which everything else is tested.
2) God's Word is not only true/truth, but it is Psalm 119:68, 67, 71 -	
3) God's Word is not only true/truth and good but it is time Psalm 119:89, 152, 2 -	less and!
Question #2: What does God's Word DO?	
1) God's Word can inspire us to awe and worship of God! Psalm 119:161 -	
2) God's Word can cause us to properly grieve and mourn Psalm 119:136 -	over sin (ours and others).
3) God's Word can guide and direct us through the danger Psalm 119:9, 11; Matthew 4 -	rs and temptations of life!
4) God's Word can give hope and courage to the hopeless	s and the faint-hearted!

Psalm 119:105, 111, 114, 165; Romans 10:17; Psalm 119:50 -

Question #3 - How should we RESPOND to God's Word?

1) We can pray and ask God to help us delight in and His Word.
Psalm 119:14 -
2) As an expression of our love for God, we can God's Word.
Psalm 119:88, 115 -
3) For ongoing growth, worship, and joy, we can memorize and think upon God's Word.
Psalm 119:97, 148 -
4) As comfort and strength for our soul, we can persevere in God's Word.
Psalm 119:140 -
Bonus Question: How does Luke 24:44 factor into studying Psalm 119?
"These are My words that I spoke to you while I was still with you, that <u>everything written about Me</u> in <u>the Law of Moses</u> and <u>the Prophets</u> and <u>THE PSALMS</u> <u>must be fulfilled</u> ." (Luke 24:44)
Note: ONLY Jesus truly lived according to the of this Psalm; the rest of us not so much!
