Introduction

- Miraculous signs accompanied the Gospel in the times of the Apostles. (Mark 16:20; Heb. 2:3-4)
- The revelation of the authoritative Word of God (revelation of Scripture) was completed in the times of the Apostles. (Rev. 22:18-19; 2 Timothy 3:16-17)
- The purpose for every spiritual gift is serving one another for the common good. (1 Corinthians 12:7; 1 Peter 4:10-11)

When tongues are exercised without content, empty confusion results.

Scriptures: 2 Timothy 4:2; 1 Timothy 4:13; Ephesians 4:11-12

When tongues are empty of comprehension, harmful disunity results.

Scriptures: v. 9-11, 13; Ephesians 4:13-14

When the members use gifts constructively, progressive maturity results.

Scriptures: v. 12; 1 Corinthians 12:31; Ephesians 4:15-16

When mind, spirit and body are consciously engaged in the use of spiritual gifts, fruitful worship results.

Scriptures: v. 13-19; Mark 12:30; 1 Corinthians 14:32-33; Galatians 5:23
