## INTRODUCTION

### I. WORSHIP THAT HONORS THE CHARACTER AND NATURE OF GOD

**1) Verse 26:** There can be (should be) a richness of diversity in different aspects of our worship and yet everything must be done with the ultimate goal of loving \_\_\_\_\_ (of building up others in Christ).

**2) Verses 27-32:** In our worship, there is to be structure and order that prioritizes edification and that demonstrates preference for and \_\_\_\_\_ towards one another.

**3) Verses 33-35:** The context of these verses is addressing prominent speaking gifts and roles, which result in ongoing growth, maturity, and edification in the body of Christ; in this way (in these roles), when the body is gathered for \_\_\_\_\_ worship, God desires and commands for men to lead in these areas and for women to honor and respect God's design.

*1 Corinthians 11:4-5a -*

**4) Verses 36-38:** This is not Paul's opinion but God's word; to reject this teaching is to reject the \_\_\_\_\_ command.
