We often settle for\_\_\_\_\_\_ saviors which provide only fleeting moments of peace and joy when our desperate situation calls for divine deliverance.

## What do we learn from the angelic news?

Jesus is a historically Savior. (v. 11a) Scriptures: Isaiah 9:6; Luke 2:4

Jesus is a supremely \_\_\_\_\_ Savior. (v. 11b) Scripture: Matthew 1:21; Acts 10:36; 2:36

Jesus is \_\_\_\_\_\_ in mission (Savior), identity (Christ) and authority (Lord).

## Jesus is the divinely \_\_\_\_\_ Savior. (v. 12) Scripture: Philippians 2:8; John 3:16-17

Jesus is a gloriously \_\_\_\_\_ Savior. (v. 13-14) Scripture: John 14:27;

Jesus alone is the Savior you need to \_\_\_\_\_\_ you from sin, pain, and hopelessness.

"May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that by the power of the Holy Spirit you may abound in hope." (Romans 15:13)
