INTRODUCTION

I. A SALVATION TOO GLORIOUS FOR HALF-HEARTED HOPE
The Long-Awaited FIRST Command: Hope! (verse 13)
Note: Set your hope fully on the grace that is on the way!!! Psalm 16:11 -
Note: The phrase "preparing your minds for action" could more literally be translated as "gird up the loins of your mind" or "gather together the of your chaotic, distracted thinking".
The Always-Relevant NEGATIVE Command: Don't be! (verse 14) John 14:23-24a -
Note: If this verse teaches us anything, it teaches us that WE ALL have a past, an past.

Romans 12:1b; Colossians 3:2; Ephesians 5:8-10; Philippians 4:8 -

The All-Encompassing POSITIVE Command: Be! (verses 15-16)
Leviticus 11:45; Ephesians 5:1-2 -
Note: God is passionate about HIS GLORY and THE GOOD of His people. The wonderful truth is that
God is <i>glorified BY</i> and our <i>greatest good is accomplished IN</i> our holiness, our in holiness.
The Femure 1 celting COREDING Commands Wells in cells 1 (verse 17)
The Forward-Looking SOBERING Command: Walk in godly! (verse 17)
Note: Because God is our Father, we are to consciously live each day in His holy!
