## What does a child of God know and how does it matter?

1. We have been divinely redeemed from absolute **futility**. (v. 18a)

*Scriptures: Ephesians 2:1-3*

2. We have been set free at a most precious **price**. (v. 18b-19)

*Scriptures: 1 Timothy 2:5-6; Matthew 20:28*

- The law was satisfied by his righteous **life**. (2 Corinthians 5:21)
- The curse was satisfied by his sacrificial **death**. (Galatians 3:13)

3. We are the beneficiary of God's most loving **plan**. (v. 20)

*Scriptures: John 15:13; Romans 5:8; 8:31-32; Ephesians 2:7*

4. We have a most certain faith and definite **hope**. (v. 21)

*Scriptures: Isaiah 54:17; John 10:28-30; Jeremiah 17:7-8; Isaiah 50:7-9*

### **Conclusion:**

An intimate knowledge of our **redemption** produces a worshipful delight in our Redeemer which turns us from the futile ways of the world.

### **Questions to Consider:**

- A. In what ways is life without Christ absolutely futile? Why do believers still sometimes live like the unredeemed?
- B. What is the significance of the price of redemption for the child of God?
- C. How do we benefit from both Christ's sinless life and sacrificial death? What do each of these do for us?
- D. In what ways does God's plan of redemption exemplify the greatest love we can know?
- E. Why is our faith so certain? How ought this affect how we live each day?
