1 Peter 4:1a -
THE BIG POINT: When faced with any trial or hardship, we should meet that trial armed with the attitude of Jesus, armed with 'the way of' that Jesus Himself possessed.
Philippians 2:5; 1 Corinthians 2:16; Romans 12:2 -
I. ARMED WITH THE MIND OF CHRIST
1 Peter 4:1 -
1) Your VICTORY over sin is in Christ!
Note: In the 1st half of verse 1, Peter is reminding us that there was in Jesus' suffering. Hebrews 12:2; Psalm 30:5 -
Note: In the 2nd half of verse 1, Peter is describing our definitive break with sin. (Those in Christ are to sin!)
Note: At the end of verse 1, Peter uses the PERFECT TENSE of the verb form "has ceased" from sin This shows PAST action that has ONGOING FEFECT in the

2) Your WITNESS (as a Christ-follower) IS impactful and, at times, even _	!
