1 Timothy 6:11-12 -

BIG PICTURE POINT: The aim, goal, and purpose of our warfare is to see JESUS honored, treasured, obeyed, and revered in every heart, in every mind, and (even!) in every _____!

I. PORTRAIT OF A FAITHFUL FOLLOWER AND WARRIOR OF CHRIST

1) The follower of Christ is a _____ warrior. (verse 1)

Note: The character of Jesus SETS THE STANDARD for _____ one of His followers/soldiers!

2) The follower of Christ is a _____ (and a hope-filled!) warrior. (verse 2a)

“And we urge you, brothers, admonish the idle, encourage the fainthearted, help the weak, be patient with them ALL.” (1 Thessalonians 5:14)

3) The follower of Christ is a Spirit-_____ warrior. (verse 2b)

Note: We do not go through life left to our own wits and abilities; our hearts and hands are _____ because God’s glorious Spirit lives in us!

“For when I am weak, THEN I am strong.” (2 Corinthians 12:10b)

“But though we had already suffered and been shamefully treated at Philippi, as you know, we had BOLDNESS IN OUR GOD to declare to you the gospel of God in the midst of much conflict.” (1 Thessalonians 2:2)

“For you yourselves know, brothers, that our coming to you was not in vain.” (1 Thessalonians 2:1)

Note: That phrase “not in vain” (1 Thess. 2:1) could better be translated as “not _____ handed”.

“So, being affectionately desirous of you, we were ready to share with you not only THE GOSPEL of God but also OUR OWN SELVES, because you had become very dear to us.” (1 Thessalonians 2:8)

4) The follower of Christ is a _____ (“attacking-the-true-problem”) warrior. (verses 3-5)

*“Doomed souls are inside their fortresses of ideas, which become their prisons and eventually their tombs - unless they are delivered from them by belief in the truth.”
(John MacArthur, 2nd Corinthians, page 329)*
