INTRODUCTION

"If I SPEAK in the tongues of men and of angels, <u>but have not love</u>, <u>I am a noisy gong</u> <u>or a clanging cymbal</u>. And if I have PROPHETIC POWERS, and UNDERSTAND ALL MYSTERIES and ALL KNOWLEDGE, and if I HAVE ALL FAITH, so as to remove mountains, <u>but have not love</u>, <u>I am nothing</u>. If I GIVE AWAY all I have, and if I DELIVER UP MY BODY to be burned, <u>but have not love</u>, <u>I gain nothing</u>." (1 Corinthians 13:1-3)

Note: The Book of Revelation is meant to inspire worship, wonder, love, and praise!

I. THE REVELATION OF JESUS CHRIST

Revelation 1:1a -

1) Verse 1 provides not only the purpose of this book but the <u>essential</u> interpretive principle!

"John's prophecy is primarily the revelation of Jesus Christ, not the revelation of future events. <u>You must not divorce the Person from the prophecy</u>, for without the Person there could be no fulfillment of the prophecy." (Warren Wiersbe)

"You must not do that! I am a fellow servant with you and your brothers who hold to the testimony of Jesus. Worship God.' For the <u>testimony of Jesus</u> IS <u>the spirit of prophecy</u>." (Revelation 19:10)

Revelation 1:1b -

2) This revelation comes FROM the Father, TO the Son, TO believers, which means that this is one more way that the Father both fulfills His will and expresses His <u>pleasure</u> in His Son!

"No longer do I call you servants, for the <u>servant does not know</u> what his master is doing; BUT I have called you <u>friends</u>, <u>for ALL that I have heard from My Father I have made known to you</u>." (John 15:15)

Revelation 1:1c-2 -

3) Jesus utilized angels to communicate and show this glorious revelation to John, the Apostle (John, the disciple whom Jesus <u>loved</u>).

Revelation 1:9 and Matthew 20:22-23

Note: John received this revelation, late in life, most likely around the year <u>95</u> AD, while wicked, cruel, paranoid Domitian was Emperor over Rome.

Revelation 1:3 -

4) We are a BLESSED people to read, hear, understand, and obey this revelation of Jesus!

Four Ways that Believers have Sought to Understand & Interpret this Book:

The HISTORICISM Method of Interpretation: Revelation is a timeline of church history.

The PRETERIST Method of Interpretation: Revelation is mostly a historical <u>record</u> of events that took place (past tense!) in the first-century Roman Empire.

The IDEALIST Method of Interpretation: Revelation is mostly not tied to specific historical events at all but is rather a book of principles, images, and scenes that contrast the <u>battle</u> between good and evil and the ultimate victory of Jesus.

The FUTURIST Method of Interpretation: Revelation is mostly prophecy that looks <u>forward</u> to and predicts real future events.

Revelation 1:3 and Revelation 22:7

Note: In the Book of Revelation, bringing things full circle, we will see God's plan, which began in Genesis, is brought to completion <u>IN</u> Jesus Christ.

- 1. How is 1st Corinthians 13:1-3 helpful in our approach to studying the Book of Revelation?
- 2. Why are the first five words of Revelation chapter 1, verse 1, so important? What do they teach us about how we ought to interpret this entire book?
- 3. How is the Book of Revelation unique? What does it reveal about Jesus that other books do not?
- 4. Are you excited to study the Book of Revelation? Why or why not?
- 5. Why do you think the Book of Revelation begins (1:3) and ends (22:7) with "blessing"?
