

Sermon Series: Revelation - Jesus Revealed Sermon Title: The Thanksgiving Song of Heaven Scripture: Revelation 11:14-19 Stephen Schultze Sunday, November 19, 2023

Introduction:

In this world, even the best of kings, rulers, or leaders are at best disappointing and at worst, corrupt, selfish destroyers.

At the sound of the 7th Trumpet...

- **1.** The Lord Jesus Christ is enthroned, and the earthly kingdom is replaced by the divine. (v. 15)
- 2. The heavenly response to the enthronement of the Sovereign Lord over earth's kingdom is complete submission & thanksgiving. (v. 16-17)

Scriptures: Psalm 72:11

3. The enthronement of Jesus' signals that the completion of God's salvation plan is at hand. (v. 18)

Scriptures: Psalm 2; Hebrews 9:27; Psalm 1:5-6; *Proverbs 13:13; Isaiah 40:10; Matthew 5:11-12*)

John's Chiasm highlighting the conclusion of God's Salvation Plan:

"The nations raged, but your wrath came,

A and the time for the <u>dead to be judged</u>,

B and for rewarding your servants, the prophets and saints

B and [for rewarding] those who fear your name, both small and great,

A and for destroying the destroyers of the earth."

4. In the symbols of the ark & the storm, the presence of God in His mercy to His people and His judgment upon the earth is made manifest. (v. 19)

Scriptures: Revelation 21:3; Exodus 9:13-26; Joshua 10:11; Ezekiel 38:22-23; 1 Corinthians 15:25-26

Conclusion:

Rejoice and give thanks to God for His reign is sure & good, and his presence is with His people forever.
