the sound of the 7 th Trumpet John sees
The Lord Jesus Christ, and the earthly kingdom is replaced by the divine. (v. 15)
The heavenly response to the enthronement of the Sovereign Lord over earth's kingdom is complete submission & (v. 16-17)
Scriptures: Psalm 72:11
The enthronement of Jesus' signals that the completion of God's is at hand. (v. 18
Scriptures: Psalm 2; Hebrews 9:27; Psalm 1:5-6; Proverbs 13:13; Isaiah 40:10; Matthew 5:11-12)
John's Chiasm highlighting the conclusion of God's Salvation Plan: "The nations raged, but your wrath came, A and the time for the dead to be judged, B and for rewarding your servants, the prophets and saints B and [for rewarding] those who fear your name, both small and great, A and for destroying the destroyers of the earth."
In the symbols of the ark & the storm, the of God in His mercy to His people and His judgment upon the earth is made manifest. (v. 19)
