INTRODUCTION

Luke 12:13-21 and Revelation 18:1-3

Verses 1-3: Introduction: The destruction of Satan's kingdom is an absolute certainty; we see a picture here of "coming-yet-already-established" <u>ruin!</u>

"For the earth WILL BE FILLED with the knowledge of the glory of the LORD as the waters cover the sea." (Habakkuk 2:14)

I. THE KINGDOM OF DARKNESS DESTROYED

Revelation 18:4

Verse 4: Separation - Pursue holiness! Don't be <u>blind</u> to the temptations you face!

"I appeal to you therefore, brothers, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a <u>living</u> sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship. Do not be <u>conformed</u> to this world, but be <u>transformed</u> by the <u>renewal of your mind</u>, that by testing you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect." (Romans 12:1-2)

"<u>Take care</u>, and <u>be on your guard</u> against ALL COVETOUSNESS, for one's life does not consist in the abundance of his possessions." (Luke 12:15)

"But I am afraid that as the serpent deceived Eve by his cunning, YOUR THOUGHTS will be <u>led astray</u> from a <u>sincere and pure devotion to Christ</u>." (2 Corinthians 11:3)

Revelation 18:5-8

Verses 5-8: Condemnation - God is mighty; He is not mocked! In perfect righteousness and justice, God <u>fully</u> repays Babylon for all her sins, which are heaped as high as heaven itself!

"If anyone would come after Me, let him <u>deny himself</u> and <u>take up his cross</u> and <u>follow Me</u>.

For whoever would save his life will lose it,

but whoever loses his life for My sake and the gospel's will save it." (Mark 8:34-35)

"For I will be merciful towards their iniquities, and I will remember their sins no more." (Hebrews 8:12)

Revelation 18:9-19

Verses 9-19: Lamentation - Sadly, all the people described here are NOT lamenting over their sin and over the ways that they have offended God; they are sad because they have lost their <u>idols</u> of power, opportunity, business, luxury, and money.

"<u>Do not love the world</u> or the things in the world. If anyone loves the world, the love of the Father is not in him. For ALL that is in the world - the desires of the flesh and the desires of the eyes and pride of life - is not from the Father but is from the world. <u>And the world is PASSING AWAY along with its desires</u>, BUT <u>whoever does the will of God ABIDES FOREVER</u>." (1 John 2:15-17)

Revelation 18:20

Verse 20: Celebration - Rejoice that God is working all things together for His glory and for the <u>good</u> of His people!

Revelation 18:21-24

Verses 21-24: Illustration - The Kingdom of Darkness will soon disappear; it will become like a lifeless, joyless, dreary, dismal, miserable <u>empty</u> shell.

"For what does it profit a man to gain the whole world and forfeit his soul?"

For what can a man give in return for his soul?" (Mark 8:36-37)

"Everyone then who hears these words of Mine and does them will be like a wise man who built his house on the rock. And the rain fell, and the floods came, and the winds blew and beat on that house, BUT IT DID NOT FALL, because it had been FOUNDED ON THE ROCK." (Matthew 7:24-25)

- 5. According to verse 20, why should heaven and the people of God rejoice?
