INTRODUCTION

Note: These first 10 verses of Revelation 19 contain the four songs in the Bible!
Note: "Hallelujah" is a word (a command!) meaning: "Praise the Lord!" or "Praise Yahweh!"
Note: In the Bible, the word "hallelujah" only appears in places: in the Psalms (scattered throughout Psalms 104-150) AND in the book of Revelation (chapter 19, verses 1-8).
I. THE FINAL FOUR HALLELUJAHS
Revelation 19:1-2 -
Hallelujah #1 - Praise God because He possesses salvation, glory, and power; His judgments align perfectly with what is true and just; and He has dealt decisively with those who have unjustly hated and murdered His people.
John 1:14 and Romans 6:23
Revelation 19:3 - Hallelujah #2 - Praise God because the defeat and the destruction of the Kingdom of Darkness is a
final, irreversible, eternal!

1 Thessalonians 1:9b-10

Revelation 19:4-5 -
Hallelujah #3 - Praise God because EVERY SINGLE, no matter how "small" or "great", will share in the joy, worship, and victory around God's gracious and amazing throne!
1 Corinthians 10:31; Psalm 96:3-4; 2 Corinthians 2:14

Revelation 19:6-9 -
Hallelujah #4 - Praise God because God WILL "finish the work" of purifying and glorifying His Bride, His people! Their joy, just as Jesus prayed for and died to secure, will be!

Revelation 19:10 -

The Surprising and Wrong "Anti-Hallelujah" Action: John needs to be reminded that the focus, the worship, and the attention MUST always be on GOD because the testimony of Jesus (the truth concerning Jesus) IS the very spirit (the heart, the purpose!) of _____ prophecy!
