I. PARADISE REGAINED

Revelation 21:9-11 -

1) God wants us to understand the Bride of Christ (the people of God) WITHIN THE CONTEXT of their future home, their future environment, their future joy, their future _____ with Him!

"In My Father's house are many rooms. If it were not so, would I have told you that I go to prepare a place for you? And if I go to prepare a place for you, I will come again and will take you to Myself, that where I am you may be also." (John 14:2-3)

Revelation 21:12-14 -

"...he was looking forward to the city that has foundations, whose designer and builder is God." (Hebrews 11:10)

"So then you are no longer strangers and aliens, but you are fellow citizens with the saints and members of the household of God, built on the FOUNDATION of the apostles and prophets, Christ Jesus Himself being the cornerstone, in whom the whole structure, being joined together, grows into a holy temple in the Lord."

(Ephesians 2:19-21)

Revelation 21:15-21 -

3) At every level and in every way, this city shines with a rare and costly beauty, strength, dignity, and _____.

Revelation 21:22-27 -

4) In this city, the Father and the Lamb unveil the splendor and the sufficiency of Their presence! In this city, all the kings, all the nations, all the peoples find their greatest and highest joy IN ______, in praising and honoring God for who and what He is!

"The sun shall be no more your light by day, nor for brightness shall the moon give you light; but the LORD will be your everlasting light and your God will be your glory. Your sun shall no more go down, nor your moon withdraw itself; for the LORD will be your everlasting light, and your days of mourning shall be ended." (Isaiah 60:19-20)

"For here we have no lasting city, but we seek the city that is to come. Through Him then let us continually offer up a sacrifice of praise to God, that is, the fruit of lips that acknowledge His name." (Hebrews 13:14-15)

Revelation 22:1-5 -
