. THE PLAGUE OF PRIDE
Judges 12:1 -
1) The Tribe of Ephraim was plagued by pride, and their pride revealed itself through their angry words and through their for glory, recognition, and prominence.
"for they loved the glory that comes from man more than the glory that comes from God." (John 12:43)
Judges 12:2-6 -
2) A little sin (pride, anger, jealousy, bitterness, resentment, etc.) goes a long way! But God calls us to something so much better; God calls us to humbly pursue!
(Proverbs 15:1, 4; 17:14, 27; 20:22; Luke 17:3-4; Rom. 13:8-10; Eph. 4:1-3; Phil. 2:3-11)
