Introduction – Two Meanings of Betray:

1. A distinctive, faithful, public voice.

2 Chronicles 18:1-27; Romans 6:15-23

2 Chronicles 18:4 – "Is there not here another prophet of the Lord"?

2 Chronicles 18:13 - "What my God says, that I will speak."

Application: How do your lips betray your Lord?

2. The threat of wicked, worldly power.

John 18:19-24, 15:18; Deuteronomy 7:1-4

2 Chronicles 18:23 - "Then Zedekiah...struck Micaiah on the cheek"

Application: Do you face worldly pressure, ridicule, or hatred? Do you know of others who do?

3. The <u>ordinary power</u> of <u>God</u> over <u>crafty</u>, <u>wicked</u> people.

Matthew 6:25-34; Psalm 73

2 Chronicles 18:29 – "I will disguise myself and go into battle"

2 Chronicles 18:33 – "A certain man drew his bow at random"

Application: What is God's ordinary power? How can this give us comfort in encounters with crafty people plotting against us?

Summary:

Devote yourselves to distinctive, faithful public testimony to the Lord.

Recognize the power wielded by wickedness in this world but do not fear that power.
