INTRODUCTION

"For to me to live is Christ, and to die is gain." (Philippians 1:21)

- I. WALKING WORTHY OF THE GOSPEL BY STANDING, STRIVING, SUFFERING
- A. Walk Worthy! (Philippians 1:27a)
- 1) This huge, all-encompassing command to "walk worthy of the Gospel" immediately highlights OUR <u>NEED</u> for God's grace, God's presence, and God's wisdom in our lives!
- 2) Walking worthy of the Gospel" has NOTHING to do with earning God's love or with achieving salvation; rather, it has EVERYTHING to do with living a life of gratitude, joy, and thanksgiving to Christ for the life and salvation He has <u>ALREADY</u> given us!

(1 John 4:19; Romans 5:8; Ephesians 1:4b-6)

3) "Walking worthy of the Gospel" is a big, beautiful, all-encompassing <u>DAILY</u> GOAL!

"I appeal to you therefore, brothers, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship."

(Romans 12:1)

Philippians 1:27b -

B. STAND: We can stand firm upon truth in <u>unity</u> with our fellow brothers & sisters.

(John 14:6; John 17:17; John 8:31b-32; Jude 3b; Romans 12:2)

Note: We DON'T do this alone!

Philippians 1:27b-28 -

C. STRIVE: We can courageously strive side-by-side to advance GOD'S work!

(1 Peter 5:7; Matthew 28:20; Romans 8:28-39)

Note: We DON'T do this alone!

Philippians 1:29-30 -

D. SUFFER: We can confidently suffer and endure hardship for the cause of Christ!

- 1) Our suffering is NOT an accident! It has been "granted" (given) to us by God! (Phil. 1:29)
- 2) You can trust God to <u>use</u> suffering to mature, to grow, and to refine you! (Gen. 50:20)
- 3) When we suffer for Christ, Jesus is glorified and <u>others</u> are helped through our witness and testimony! (Acts 7; Phil. 1:12-14; 4:22)
- 4) Any suffering we experience here on earth will truly seem like <u>nothing</u> compared to the vast, eternal, infinite joy and glory that is to come! (2 Cor. 4:17)
- 5) Jesus draws near to and strengthens those who suffer for Him! (2 Tim. 4:16-18)

- 4. In what ways do you see your fellow Christians standing, striving, and suffering well? In what ways can we improve in these areas?
- 5. What kinds of truths, verses, and realities are helpful to meditate on in the midst of suffering?
