INTRODUCTION

I. WALKING WORTHY OF THE GOSPEL BY STANDING, STRIVING, SUFFERING

A. Walk Worthy! (Philippians 1:27a)

1) This huge, all-encompassing command to “walk worthy of the Gospel” immediately highlights OUR _____ for God’s grace, God’s presence, and God’s wisdom in our lives!

2) “Walking worthy of the Gospel” has NOTHING to do with earning God’s love or with achieving salvation; rather, it has EVERYTHING to do with living a life of gratitude, joy, and thanksgiving to Christ for the life and salvation He has _____ given us!

(1 John 4:19; Romans 5:8; Ephesians 1:4b-6)

“I appeal to you therefore, brothers, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship.”

(Romans 12:1)
