## INTRODUCTION

"For to me to live is Christ, and to die is gain." (Philippians 1:21)

- I. WALKING WORTHY OF THE GOSPEL BY STANDING, STRIVING, SUFFERING

  A. Walk Worthy! (Philippians 1:27a)

  1) This huge, all-encompassing command to "walk worthy of the Gospel" immediately highlights OUR \_\_\_\_\_\_ for God's grace, God's presence, and God's wisdom in our lives!

  2) Walking worthy of the Gospel" has NOTHING to do with earning God's love or with achieving salvation; rather, it has EVERYTHING to do with living a life of gratitude, joy, and thanksgiving to Christ for the life and salvation He has \_\_\_\_\_\_ given us!

  (1 John 4:19; Romans 5:8; Ephesians 1:4b-6)
- 3) "Walking worthy of the Gospel" is a big, beautiful, all-encompassing \_\_\_\_\_ GOAL!
